Guidelines for Mentor Participation in MABA Mentorship Program

It is MABA's goal that mentors and students are able to form beneficial relationships that foster the growth and professional development of law students. To achieve this goal, MABA has adopted the following guidelines.

- (1) Number of Meetings Per Academic Semester: It is encouraged that mentors meet inperson with law students at least twice per academic semester.
- (2) Meeting Locations: Meetings between program participants should be scheduled in public locations, e.g. at MABA mixers, in restaurants or coffee shops, or at other MCLE or bar association events. MABA strongly discourages meeting at bars or at the residence of either the law student or mentor.
- (3) Complaints: If any participating party feels that they have been sexually harassed by another program participant or has been subject to other unwanted, harassing, or coercive behavior, a report should be immediately made to 2023 President Magdalena Casas (president@mabaattorneys.com) or MABA Mentorship Committee Chair Diego Arp (diegoaarp@gmail.com). All reports are confidential.

Individuals who are found to have violated: (1) MABA's Code of Civility, (2) Policy Against Unlawful Harassment, Discrimination, and Retaliation, or (3) Bylaws are subject to expulsion from participation in the program.

(4) Contacting Your Mentor/Law Student: In addition to in-person meetings, students should feel comfortable emailing their mentors regarding professional opportunities or questions related to course-work or school activities. In-person or email communication is encouraged. Texting, while convenient, should not be the sole means of communication between mentors and students.

While MABA encourages students and mentors to learn more about one another, especially with respect to shared experiences, e.g. "What it is like to be a first-generation attorney," participants should not engage in conversations about intimate matters. MABA urges all participants to exercise their best personal and professional judgment while participating in the program with regard to their conduct.
